From an early childhood in Kenya through to polishing the pews of her church in Portsmouth as a teenager to her appointment as the first Archdeacon of Dorchester Judy has always been obedient to God's call on her life. She had the privilege of being part of an historic moment when she was one of the youngest of 37 women who were among the first to be ordained priest in the Church of England in Coventry Cathedral in 1994. Since 2014 she has been serving our Churches, people, and clergy in her current role.

Remembering all who have gone before us in faith, and in communion with all the saints, we commit ourselves, one for another and our whole life to Christ our God;

to you O Lord.

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory, send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.
