For the Gospel we say:


Hear the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ **Glory to you O Lord.**

The Reflection

Each week we will hear from a variety of reputable and orthodox teachers from centuries past. Extracts will be read to us from sermons, hymns, theological treatises, Biblical commentaries, letters, prayers and poems ... to deepen our faith. This should remind us that all scripture is God breathed and that it's truths and the lessons learnt from them, through the ages, are still useful for us today.



This week's reflection is from Bishop Ambrose of Milan, based on his commentary on the Psalms, including today's Ps. 145.

Ambrose, was born into a Christian Roman family, Aurelius. He became a governor in Italy's northern provinces before the age of 30 and as he was sent, the prefect gave him a word of prophetic advice: "Go, conduct yourself not as a judge, but as a bishop."

After attending a meeting to bring unity to the church in Milan all parties present insisted he became their new Bishop. His style of preaching and use of congregational singing, became very influential. Because of his influence, hymn singing became an important part of the Western liturgy. One of his most famous students was to be Augustine, whom he baptised into the faith and influenced deeply by his teaching.

The Creed

We pray for those in special need ... (and so we pray)

Comfort and heals all those who suffer in body, mind, or spirit; give them courage and hope in their troubles; and bring them the joy of your salvation.

In you O Lord

do we put our trust.

We remember those who have died and pray for the bereaved ... (and so we pray)

Remembering all who have gone before us in faith, and in communion with all the saints, we commit ourselves, one for another and our whole life to Christ our God;

to you O Lord.

Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Peace

Jesus says: 'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.'

The peace of the Lord be always with you **And also with you.**

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here

His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, at all times and in all places to give you thanks and praise holy Father, heavenly King almighty and eternal God through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

For he is your living Word through him you have created all things from the beginning and formed us in your own image.

Through him you have freed us from the slavery of sin, giving him to be born of a woman and to die upon the cross; you raised him from the dead and exalted him to your right hand on high.

Through him you have sent upon us Your holy and life-giving Spirit, and made us a people for your own possession.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, forever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks. He broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them saying; Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Great is the mystery of faith
Christ has died
Christ is risen
Christ will come again.

Accept through him, our great high priest, This, our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine majesty, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, In the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father Almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power Be yours for ever and ever. Amen
