Romans 8:26-39 (NIVUK)

²⁶In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. ²⁷And he who

searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God.

²⁸ And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who^{28a} have been called according to his purpose. ²⁹ For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. ³⁰ And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified.

³¹ What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? ³² He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all – how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? ³³ Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died – more than that, who was raised to life – is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? ³⁶ As it is written:

'For your sake we face death all day long;
we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.'

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, ³⁹ neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Going Deeper

Bible Notes: Romans 8.26-39

Paul's great positive statement of the marvellous outcome of Christ's work under God reaches its climax. It is no wonder that it has become one of the best known passages in his writings. It is marked by huge confidence and by grandeur of claims for what has been done and what will, for sure, come in the future.

In characteristic manner, this confidence is couched in the imagery of the law, the concern to live in obedience to God's scheme for the conduct of life if it is to be well-pleasing to him. So, as this letter has stressed throughout, God has responded to our inability to meet this demand by the free gift of acceptance – made available to us in and through Jesus, mediator between God and humanity. All that is necessary is for us to take the gift into ourselves, make it our own, and live by its fruits. It seems like simplicity itself and astonishes us.

The confidence that is thereby proper for us is unlimited. It is as if we are made immune from all possible assaults, whether physical or spiritual. Notice that in Paul's day there was a different sense from our own of the structure of the universe: for one thing, it was much smaller than it is for us, and it was peopled by spiritual powers, beneficent and malicious. In their different ways, these came between God and ourselves. But now we have been given a pass that gives immunity to all these forces and gives us direct access to the marvellous and life-assuring presence of God himself, who loves us and, in Jesus, gave himself for us. It is a breathtaking way of stating the Christian message, far removed from much of modern religion.

Family time

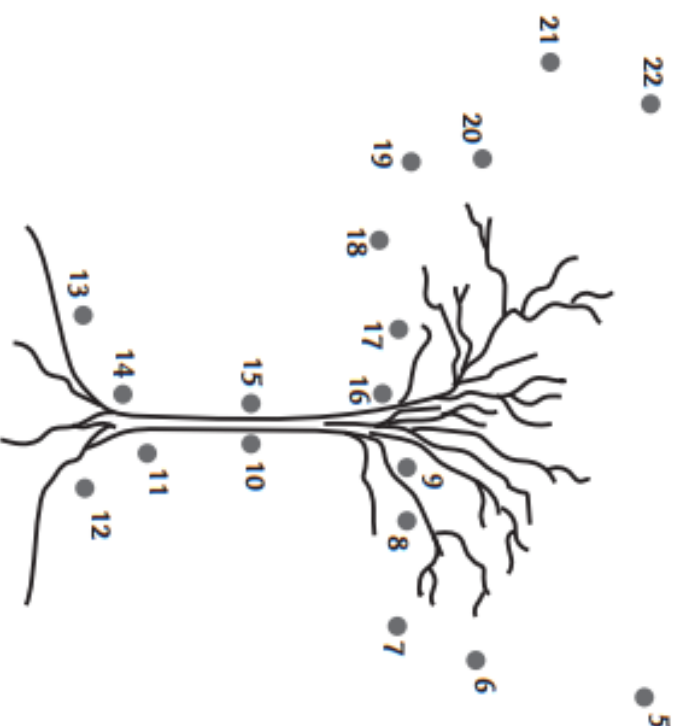
Talk How do you imagine the kingdom of God? What could you use to describe it?

Join the dots to form what one of the symbols of the kingdom grows into.

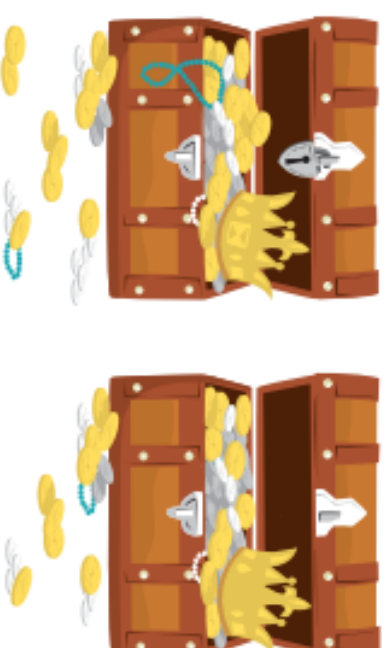
