Going Deeper

Bible Notes: Romans 9.1-5

For most modern Christians, the doctrine expounded in Paul's first eight chapters seems to make a self-contained whole: it is the core content of the Christian gospel. When it comes to what follows, the attention of many tends to wander. There is good but unexciting moral teaching from chapter 12, but chapters 9-11 seem a complex distraction. What is involved is the matter of Israel, God's ancient people.

We need to recognise that these chapters did not look like that to Paul. His argument flows on without interruption and what he wishes to show here is essential to his case. We need to recognise that the Christian community in Rome in the 50s of the first century was, it seems, made up as much of converted Jews as of Gentiles, and probably included small, synagogue-like groups scattered in a number of parts of the city. One of Paul's main reasons for writing was to ease tensions between the two sorts of Christians and to promote unity and harmony. To that end, he must show that the coming of Jesus is, though a new beginning, nevertheless in continuity with God's age-old purpose for his people Israel.

It is of course a mammoth task and it is no wonder that readers who do not share Paul's heritage in Judaism are inclined to lose track in these chapters. The present passage makes plain at the start the conviction and emotion which Paul brings to this argument. He cannot possibly renounce his belief in the countless gifts which God has bestowed on his people – including supremely Jesus the Messiah himself – and he is distraught by the major failure of Israel (so far) to accept this final glory that has come to them.

We often think of Paul as the apostle to the gentiles, but here he portrays his real anguished concern for his own Jewish people. It must have been a puzzle to the early Christians that the mass of the Jewish people did not join them, but increasingly separated themselves from them.. But even in Paul's day most Jews had not followed him into the Jesus community, had not accepted Jesus as the messiah or believed the news of his resurrection. Paul never suggests that God has cut them off; here he asserts that all the promises, covenants and law remain valid. In his despair at their non-response, however, he suggests he would be prepared to sacrifice his own place 'in Christ' if it could bring them in.


A personal prayer

Talk How do you think we could share what we have with others?


Do Each time you stop to eat this week, think of ways you could be generous with your time and gifts.


