The Liturgy of the Word

Reading Philippians 1.21-30 read by Kate Holliday

21 For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. 22 If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labour for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! 23 I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; 24 but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body. 25 Convinced of this, I know that I will remain, and I will continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, 26 so that

through my being with you again your boasting in Christ Jesus will abound on account of me.

27 Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or only hear about you in my absence, I will know that you stand firm in the one Spirit, striving together as one for the faith of the gospel 28 without being frightened in any way by those who oppose you. This is a sign to them that they will be destroyed, but that you will be saved – and that by God. 29 For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe in him, but also to suffer for him, 30 since you are going through the same struggle you saw I had, and now hear that I still have.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

Jesus says: 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

We know that Christians have shared a sign of peace since the very earliest days of the Church. In these times, it may seem strange to 'share the Peace.' But peace is from the heart and from God. God's peace in the Spirit moves among us and unites us, physically distanced yet one in the Body of Christ.

Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh; as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, he lived on earth and went about among us; he opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us; and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption. As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever **Amen.**

Going Deeper

This week's reading: **Philippians 1.21-30**

Bible Notes

Paul wrote this letter to the Philippians around 20-25 years after the resurrection. He had already visited Philippi; he knew the people he was writing to and was fond of them. Throughout the letter, Paul recognises that life as a Christian isn't easy. In Philippi, people struggled with low life expectancy, disability, and slavery. Paul calls for unity in the Spirit, regardless of their standing in society – it is the 'faith of the gospel' that unites them. This call to be found 'standing firm in one spirit' questions the social order of the day, where each person is out for themselves and knows their place in the strict social hierarchy.

Today, we are still living within social rules and hierarchies that tend to value one person over another. We still struggle with issues of life and faith, and with 'doing the right thing'. Throughout all of this, Paul's call for us to stand together and encourage each other, as we face the difficult decisions of life, is as valid today as it ever was

In times of sluggishness and laziness, God of patience, wait for me.



Talk How do we know the right choices to make?


Do Watch Moana [U]. Moana chooses to take on a daring mission to help her people. She keeps going, even when it's hard.

Activity time




Add the expression Paul might be making, as he has to decide whether to stay with his friends or go to be with Jesus.
