Summary of the law

Reading Matthew 25.14-30 read by Kate Holliday

- **14** 'Again, it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted his wealth to them. **15** To one he gave five bags of gold, to another two bags, and to another one bag, each according to his ability. Then he went on his journey. **16** The man who had received five bags of gold went at once and put his money to work and gained five bags more. **17** So also, the one with two bags of gold gained two more. **18** But the man who had received one bag went off, dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

The Peace

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

We know that Christians have shared a sign of peace since the very earliest days of the Church. In these times, it may seem strange to 'share the Peace.' But peace is from the heart and from God. God's peace in the Spirit moves among us and unites us, physically distanced yet one in the Body of Christ.

Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh; as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, he lived on earth and went about among us; he opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us; and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever **Amen**.



Going Deeper



Bible Notes

Matthew 25, 14-30

This is Jesus' third parable in this series about living wisely, with an eye to the end of the world as we know it. Again, the storyline involves waiting for one whose arrival is delayed. An absent master returns unexpectedly, bringing reward to some and punishment to others.

Matthew and his Jewish readers would have seen here

a reference to Jesus returning as the Son of Man, a significant figure in the Jewish apocalyptic literature that was widely read at that time, especially the long composite work known as 1 Enoch which was characterised by its lurid descriptions of the dire fate awaiting those who were rejected.

Apocalyptic discussions were the ancient equivalent of lurid computer games, popular among Jews because of its promise of vindication to an oppressed people. Nasty people are zapped, and the goodies triumph.

At around the time Matthew was writing, a decree was issued banning Messianic Jews from the synagogues (see John 9.22; 16.2). So for him and his readers the elect who would be rewarded were Messianic Jews, while those who would be punished were those who had expelled them. For they had rejected Jesus and his followers and locked themselves in a Torah-shaped box. The elect were those who acknowledged Jesus and looked forward to his coming as the Son of Man.


