And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever
Amen.

Imitators of God

Notes on the Bible readings

- Having introduced the concept of the Christian community as a body, Paul tells the Ephesians that this 'body of Christ' is based on revolutionary values that makes it altogether different from wider Roman society. Truth is the unifying principle – 'put away all falsehood' (v.25) – yet Paul quickly goes into specifics as to how this truth is to be made manifest: it is through one's behaviour.

- As someone who had to work as a tent-maker to support himself, Paul is aware that he is reliant on people beyond the church community to raise a wage. So he instructs the Ephesians in how to behave as they live and work with their non-Christian neighbours: for example, no longer sacrificing or praying to the 'civic gods' and asking for blessings and curses from them; holding themselves accountable to a higher standard in trade and commerce; realising that gaining family honour over a rival is no longer important.

- Paul goes on to speak about actions and attitudes that build up and bring down, and how the latter grieves the Holy Spirit. In describing actions that build up, he is describing God himself. Therefore, when we are kind, tender-hearted and forgiving, we are imitators of God, and are seen to be his children.

- Finally, Paul employs the language of offering and sacrifice (5.2), suggesting that if we imitate God in our behaviour, in life and in death, when others see us, they will see Christ.
